

SSC Recycle/Restroom Fees

Most SSC recycling services for events are at the regular monthly rate (except cardboard). All include delivery and bring in after the event for most areas we serve. Surcharges apply for east of Maple Falls or south of Lake Samish. These rates are effective as of 11-30-09 and subject to change.

- FoodPlus! toter \$10/toter (~150 people)
- Bottle/Can toter \$12/toter (~225 containers)
- Cardboard 4-yd \$40/container (~2 pick-up truck loads)
- Plastic film 2-yd \$40/container (tarps, Visqueen, etc)
- Portable Toilet \$80/unit - ADA \$140/unit
 - People 250 500 1000 2000 3000 4000 5000
 - (~4 hrs) 2 units 4 6 11 16 22 27
- Hand Sanitizer Quads \$75/unit (~4,500 uses)
- Stand Alone Sinks \$85/unit (~400 uses)

If alcohol is served, increase unit # by 13%. If percentage of women in attendance increases beyond half, increase toilet percentage by same amount. Based on maximum waiting line of 10 people per unit.

Romo Note: I find that you can never have enough portable toilets to satisfy your participants as they seem to want immediate access to a restroom in the 8 minutes before an event.

To give you an idea as to what our needs have been we ordered we ordered 6 portable toilets, 1 sink and 4 FoodPlus! containers for the 2009 Fairhaven Runners Waterfront 15K with about 700 participants + spectators. Trash and cardboard were picked up by Bellingham Parks and Recreation staff and there were 2 restrooms on site.

This seemed adequate, though there were some restroom lines in the minutes before the start. We did not provide any plastic bottles or cans, so the bottle toter was unnecessary.

It's also a good idea to station a volunteer to assist participants with how and where to recycle.
